Classification Title: Medical Photographer

Job Summary:

The Medical Photographer performs specialized medical and general photographic duties to support clinical, educational, research and public relations requirements. Creates and designs computer generated photographic images utilizing advanced digital imaging techniques and complex imaging program software for medical and teaching purposes.

Key Responsibilities and Typical Duties:

Core Duties

- Provides photography services to aid health care professionals in patient assessment and diagnosis.
- Provides photography services and images for website, public relations, fund raising, legal, documentary and educational purposes.
- Uses computer, software and peripheral devices to create, edit, manipulate and print digital image files.
- Produces PowerPoint slide productions for presentations.
- Performs routine maintenance, service and troubleshooting of photographic equipment.

Leadership

 Provides technical consultation and instruction to staff on medical photography techniques and procedures.

Decision-Making

- Determines techniques, materials and equipment best suited for the job.
- Interprets patient's requests, selects appropriate media and creates appropriate images.
- Responsible for quality and accuracy of images produced.
