Classification Title: Ophthalmic Technician I

Job Summary:

The Ophthalmic Technician I performs technical work involving use of a variety of testing equipment to measure and evaluate visual field, retinal function and intraocular pressure in order to evaluate conditions affecting the eye.

Key Responsibilities and Typical Duties:

Core Duties

- Reviews medical referrals and conducts preliminary tests to assess patient's tolerance to diagnose testing, assess vision, retinal function, intraocular pressure and flow of intraocular fluids.
- Performs diagnostic Ophthalmic procedures under the direction an Ophthalmologist.
- Takes anatomical and functional ocular measurements (e.g. A-Scan) and tests ocular functions.
- Organizes and analyses ophthalmological data recorded.
- Takes prescribed measurements and notations, and advises physician of unusual readings or equipment/recording problems.
- Administers advanced ocular motility and binocular function tests.

Other Related Duties

- Prepares patients for laser and minor procedures.
- Instructs and educates the patient on procedure and equipment.
- Operates, maintains and troubleshoots a variety of monitoring and recording equipment.

Assists in staff orientation and training of students.
