Classification Title: Orthotic Technician

Job Summary:

The Orthotic Technician performs technical work involving the fabrication, repair and maintenance of various orthotic devices.

Key Responsibilities and Typical Duties:

Core Duties

- Follows detailed specifications to fabricate, repair and maintain patient support appliances such as braces, splints and shoe alterations.
- Makes plaster casts from patient's limb or body impressions taken by the Certified Orthotist.
- Works with a wide range of materials including plastics, leathers and metals to create orthotic devices.
- Suggests and performs modifications to materials or components.
- Performs routine maintenance on machinery and ensures the general cleanliness of the work area.

Leadership

Assists with training of other Orthotic Technicians.

Decision-Making

Determines tools and methods used to fabricate repair orthotic devices.

 Diploma from an accredited Orthotic Technician Program or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

Physical Demands

- Stands for extended periods of time.
- Bends, stretches and lifts materials and equipment.

Work Environment
