Some duties and responsibilities may overlap between class levels. The classification specification is not intended to provide an exhaustive list of all duties performed.

Classification Title Psychologist II

Date Updated: May 20, 2008

Job Summary:

The Psychologist II provides clinical psychological assessment, diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation and program development for complex client pathologies <u>and/or</u> the Psychologist II acts as an operational supervisor or team leader.

Work at the Psychologist II level is differentiated from the Psychologist I level by the advanced clinical and specialized psychology services **and/or** provision of clinical leadership and coordination in an assigned program area.

Key Responsibilities and Typical Duties:

In addition to the duties of the Psychologist I, the Psychologist II:

Core Duties

Clinical Practice:

- Provides advanced and specialized clinical/psychological services.
- Provides psychological therapy for individuals presenting with multi-dimensional issues including comorbidity disorders.
- Provides consultations to families, teams, physicians and community partners.
- Designs and conducts in-service education and training for staff.

Clinical Lead:

- Provides program planning, development and program evaluation for their area.
- Initiates the introduction of and develops standards for new clinical programs; coordinates and monitors delivery of clinical programs.
- Analyzes work statistics of assigned team.





Other Related Duties

- May provide leadership in the development, implementation and evaluation of formal clinical research.
- May initiate, conduct and/or evaluate specific projects.
- Publishes results as appropriate.
- Responds to lawyers requests, gives expert opinion, provides medical legal judgments and participates in court proceedings.

Leadership

Clinical Practice:

- Provides clinical leadership in an area of expertise.
- Coaches and mentors staff and Psychology interns.
- Supervises Doctoral/Masters level Psychology interns and Provisionally Registered Psychologists.

Clinical Lead:

- Acts as the operational supervisor and coordinates staff resources in their assigned area.
- Participates in the recruitment, selection, orientation, training, evaluation and initial stages of discipline of staff.
- Participates in the development of annual supply, capital requirements and staffing budget as required.

Decision-Making

Clinical Practice:

- Makes independent advanced clinical decisions regarding assessment, treatment, and modification of treatment and discharge of multi-dimensional/complex clients.
- Determines client referral to other/additional mental health professionals/psychiatric resources.

Knowledge:

Education

PhD. in Psychology from an accredited university or equivalent education and experience.

Registration Requirements

Registered or Provisionally Registered with the College of Alberta Psychologists (CAP).





Working Conditions:

Physical Demands

 Minimal physical demands, but may be required to stand or sit for an extended period of times during performance of duties.

Work Environment

- General office environment.
- Travel in all weather/road conditions may be required.
- May involve working with clients who present criminal or suicidal tendencies; potential exposure to violence and aggression.
