Some duties and responsibilities may overlap between class levels. The classification specification is not intended to provide an exhaustive list of all duties performed.

Classification Title: Therapy Assistant

Date Updated: March 2, 2021

Job Summary:

The Therapy Assistant is responsible for assisting in the delivery of therapeutic rehabilitation in Audiology, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Speech Language Pathology and/or Therapeutic Recreation under the supervision of a regulated rehabilitation therapist or recreation therapist.

Key Responsibilities and Typical Duties:

Core Duties

- Screens clients and administers specific components of standardized assessment tools as assigned by the therapist.
- Assists in developing, scheduling, preparing, implementing and evaluating individual client and group programs.
- Facilitates individual and group rehabilitation activities outlined in the client's care plan.
- Provides input into client goals and interventions and contributes to the development and modification of the client's care plan.
- Adapts treatment activities based on potential risks, client limitations, changes in status, and adverse reactions and reports these changes/actions to the supervising therapist.
- Applies knowledge of disease and normal health and development to understand and report on individual clients.
- Operates, maintains, tracks and orders equipment.

Other Related Duties

- Monitors and documents client progress, and reports outcomes to supervising therapist.
- Monitors the operation of equipment and reports malfunctioning equipment.
- May participate in quality improvement initiatives as required.

Leadership

- Coaches and orients staff and Therapy Assistant students.
- Provides collegial guidance and mentoring to staff.





Decision-Making

- Makes decisions on modifications to client rehabilitation plans based on client's behaviour and symptoms.
- Observes and understands the causes of behaviour and modifies approach to enhance successful interactions and outcomes.
- Determines appropriate facilitation techniques according to the care plan.

Knowledge:

Education

Diploma from an approved post-secondary Rehabilitation Therapy Assistant program.

Working Conditions:

Physical Demands

- Considerable time is spent standing, walking, sitting and in close supportive contact with clients.
- Required to bend, pull, lift, perform variable movements and position changes (may be required to assume awkward positions).
- Must be able to transfer and/or assist with lifting clients.

Work Environment

- Primarily clean, air controlled indoor environments.
- Travel in all-weather/road conditions.
- May be subject to exposure to verbally/physically aggressive clients and/or family members.
